Quick Start Guide for HP® ProBook 640/650

Features

- Small, removable drive carrier and frame for on-the-go use
- Fits in HP ProBook 640 and HP ProBook 650 optical bays

1 FRAME INSTALLATION

1.1 CASE REMOVAL

- a. Place the laptop facedown on a flat surface.
- b. Locate the screws on the outside edge of the laptop and use a Philips screwdriver to remove them.
- c. Lift up on a corner of the bottom of the case and run your hand underneath to free the plastic tabs holding the bottom down (See Figure 1).
- d. Set the bottom of the case aside.

1.2 OPTICAL DRIVE REMOVAL

- Locate the screw securing the optical drive to the laptop and remove it (see Figure 2).
- Pull the optical drive from the optical bay and set it aside.

1.3 DP27 INSTALLATION

- Remove the bracket from the rear of the optical drive and reattach it to the rear of the DP27 (See Figure 3).
- Use the included square-shaped key to remove the carrier from the DP27 (see Figure 4).




Figure 5. The colored strip is the adhesive protective film.

- c. Insert the DP27 into the optical bay. If the DP27 does not lay flat against the laptop chassis, remove it from the bay and remove the adhesive protective film on the top of the DP27 (see Figure 5). Reinsert the DP27 and press it onto the laptop to adhere it.
- d. Insert the screw you removed earlier in Step 1.2.e and use it to secure the DP27 to the laptop.

1.4 RESEAL THE LAPTOP CASE

- a. Replace the cover and press firmly down along the edges to snap each plastic tab back into place.
- b. Reinsert the screws you removed in Step 1.1.b to secure the back cover.

2 CARRIER EJECTION

Firmly press the included key into the square keyhole on the left side of the frame to eject the carrier (see Figure 5).

3 DRIVE INSTALLATION

- a. On the rear of the carrier are two tabs holding the cover of the carrier in place. Separate the tabs and pull the cover apart from the carrier.




Figure 6. Insert the drive into the carrier.

- b. Insert a 2.5" 7mm SATA drive with the top label facing up into the carrier by compressing the foam spring and placing the drive into the carrier bottom (see Figure 6). Ensure that the unified SATA and power data connector is facing out of the rear of the carrier.




Figure 7. Press down on the cover to secure it.

- c. Replace the cover and secure it by pressing down firmly so that the tabs snap back into place (see Figure 7).

4 OPERATING YOUR DP27

Slide the DP27 carrier into the frame. Push the carrier in until it snaps into place. The drive inside of the carrier will power on automatically.

Your DP27 removable drive enclosure is now ready to use! If the drive is already formatted, it can be used right away. If the drive is brand new, or its format is not compatible with your computer, it will need to be formatted before being used. **Note that formatting a drive will erase all data on the drive, so be sure to back up your data before beginning this operation.**
